



#204 Bloodborne pathogens – Basic

This session is a three-hour class looking at bloodborne pathogens in the workplace. Participants will learn the definition of a bloodborne pathogen and recognize the ways a pathogen is transferred from person to person. Participants also will become familiar with the six most common pathogens workers can come in contact with and understand the different ways to handle a potential exposure. You will be able to define bloodborne pathogens; identify the six most common bloodborne pathogens found in the workplace; explain how these pathogens can be transferred from person to person; and describe ways to manage potential exposure.
