



#923 OSHA recordkeeping and safety management – Advanced

This session will focus on the implementation of the OSHA recordkeeping standard as an element in the overall success of an employer's safety management program. A link will be made between recordkeeping trends analysis and identifying system weaknesses to develop results-oriented objectives.
