



#263 Smoke, fire and water - live demonstration – Basic
11 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. – Wednesday, March 30

This session is a live demonstration/training opportunity of fire extinguishers, automatic fire sprinklers and the Safe House. You will use a fire extinguisher on a live fire, see a live demonstration of how fire sprinklers operate and crawl through the Safe House. This multi-part session of live demonstrations and training provides a basic understanding of how a fire starts, how an individual can escape a fire and how a fire is controlled. You will observe the cause of fire; escape a smoke-filled room; view the effectiveness of sprinkler heads; and identify and discharge the appropriate type of fire extinguisher.

You will be able to identify how smoke moves through an enclosed facility; operate the appropriate fire extinguisher for different types of fires; and describe the water flow operation of various sprinkler heads.

NOTE: Attendees must rotate through each of three 20-minute stations to receive credit.
