## Never put safety on cruise control

Your employees can face a number of hazards when working in confined spaces. The risk of a cave in, collapse or asphyxiation is present every moment spent working in these dangerous areas. Regardless of your workers' level of experience, employers must always inform their employees of the hazards and available escape routes.

BWC recommends taking the following measures to ensure your employees are safe on the road:

- Purchase safe, well-designed vehicles;
- Ensure vehicles are regularly inspected and properly maintained;
- Provide vehicle safety training;
- Require training on defensive driving;
- Develop and enforce safe driving policies.
