Playing it safe in confined spaces

Your employees can face a number of hazards when working in confined spaces. The risk of an explosion, collapse or asphyxiation is present at every moment. Regardless of your workers' level of experience, employers must always inform their employees of the hazards and available escape routes.

BWC provides instructional resources and tools for employers to help reduce confined space incidents at their work sites. These include:

- Identifying all permit required confined spaces and informing all exposed employees of the existence and location of such spaces and their hazards;
- Providing appropriate equipment for confined space air monitoring, entry and rescue;
- Training employees in confined space entry and rescue techniques;
- Prohibiting unauthorized entry into confined spaces.
