Cut it out with BWC

Employees who work with knives, glass and other sharp objects on the job are at an elevated risk of sustaining cuts and lacerations. With every cut and laceration comes the chance of infection, which can expose workers to further complications. BWC recommends using the following preventative measures to keep your workers safe:

- Analyze work conditions for potential laceration hazards;
- Minimize potential for contact with sharp edges on containers, equipment and machinery;
- Provide knives and cutters with self-retracting blades;
- Store knives and sharp objects to protect them from accidental contact.
