

ALCOHOL CUT-OFF LEVELS TABLE

For alcohol, an employee must have an alcohol concentration level equal to or in excess of the levels established in Division (A) (regardless of age) of **Section 4511.19 of the Ohio Revised Code**. These levels are shown in the table below:

ALCOHOL LEVEL

21 Years of Age or Over	Person has a concentration of eight-hundredths of one percent or more by weight of alcohol in his/her blood;
	Person has a concentration of eight-hundredths of one gram or more by weight of alcohol per two hundred ten liters of his/her breath;
	Person has a concentration of eleven-hundredths of one gram or more by weight of alcohol per one hundred milliliters of his/her urine.
Under 21	Same as age 21. Although Division B (under age 21) has different concentration levels for drivers under the age of 21, the law is constructed to apply Division A for all injured workers, regardless of age.
